

## Post-Doc at Penn State's Center for Global Workers' Rights

The School of Labor and Employment Relations at The Pennsylvania State University invites applications for the position of Post-Doctoral Scholar with the Center for Global Workers' Rights. This is a twelve-month position that begins on August 14, 2015. The Center for Global Workers' Rights was established in the fall of 2012 with the goal of promoting scholarly research and scholar-practitioner exchanges on issues related to workers' rights. It has a broad focus that includes, but is not limited to, sweatshops, precarious work, labor standards, international labor and employment law, worker organizing, and strategic corporate research and campaigns. Candidates should possess a Ph.D. in a relevant discipline, or a I.D., earned in the last three years, as well as evidence of an emerging research program relevant to the Center's interests. Scholars will receive salary, benefits, and a research/travel fund to support their work. Postdoctoral candidates will be expected to teach one course each semester. This may include teaching for a new Labor and Global Workers' Right MPS program, which is part of the Global Labour University network.

Review of applications will begin on **March 15**, **2015**, and continue until the position is filled.
