



Former LAWCHA President Nancy MacLean Testifies in Senate Hearing

I was invited by Senators Whitehouse and Stabenow and the Democratic Policy and Communications Committee to open a hearing entitled "After Janus v. AFSCME: Why Teachers and Workers are Fighting Back Against the Secret Money Campaign to Take Away Their Rights."

Because of this latest 5-4 decision, teachers, home health workers, firefighters and other public-sector workers are likely to see their living standards and collective power plummet in the coming years. But as alarming is the larger threat to democracy that has won big from this Koch-backed litigation.

My testimony is rather grim (starts about 3 mins in.) but the union women on the panel were really inspiring about what can be done, including Randi Weingarten, President of the AFT, Arizona's Teacher of the Year who is also a leader in the Red for Ed movement, and an SEIU Chicago home health care worker.
