Please help spread the word about an opportunity for college seniors, recent graduates, or rank-and-file activists who are interested in trying out a job in the labor and workers' justice movement. Applications for the 2019 WILL Empower Apprenticeship Program are now open, and are due April 15.

WILL Empower (Women Innovating Labor Leadership) is an innovative new program designed to build a new generation of women labor leaders and activists. The Apprenticeship Program serves as an on-ramp for people who want to try out a paid, fulltime job in the workers' movement. WILL Empower apprentices work for a host organization for 3 to 12 months, with a focus on organizing, research, communications, or policy etc.

Apprentices come together for a training and gathering at Georgetown University in September. They have mentors both within and outside their host organization.
